

## No Idling Policy

- No trucks are allowed to idle their engines while at a Best Buy retail location.
- *No Idling* signs are posted in plain sight outside of the dock doors at each retail location.
- Within Best Buy's "No Idle" policy the term "idle" refers to running a trucks engine during the loading or unloading of a shipment.
- Trucks use approximately 1.1 gallons of fuel every hour they idle which equates to approximately 20 pounds of carbon being dispersed into our environment.
- To reduce idling at the stores, delivery drivers will be invited to wait in the store while their truck is being loaded or unloaded.

**Note:** Inform the Loss Prevention Customer Specialist (LPCS) and the Manager on Duty (MOD) if the driver decides to wait in the store during the shipment unload.

- When a driver decides to wait in the stores break room they should be given a visitors pass (located by the receiving desk) so they can be identified by other store employees.
- If a driver is observed idling their engine an inventory associate (preferably a Supervisor or Senior) should politely explain the policy to them.
- If a driver continues to idle the engine after an Inventory associate has explained the policy please fill out the [DC Truck Feedback Form](#) and note that the driver would not follow the "no idle" policy during the delivery.
